

The San Diego Zoo: World-famous 100-acre tropical garden that houses 4,000 animals of 800 rare and exotic species. The zoo has the largest population of Giant Pandas in the U.S. and spectacular bioclimatic exhibits like Monkey Trails, Absolutely Apes, Ituri Forest, Rain Forest Aviary, Polar Bear Plunge, Gorilla Tropics, Sun Bear Forest and Tiger River.

San Diego Zoo's Wild Animal Park: Located 30 miles northeast of downtown San Diego is an 1,800-acre preserve where wild animals roam free over vast expanses as they would in their native habitats of Africa and Asia.


